## DISASTER can come any time, so TAKE PRECAUTION, before it's too late.

Hundreds of children are affected every year by earthquakes, floods, fires and other disasters.

WHY IS SCHOOL SAFETY ESSENTIAL?

- In 1995 in Dabwali (Haryana) about **200** students killed in a school fire
- Bus falling into the Yamuna River in Delhi killed 24 children in 1997
- The 2001 Bhuj Earthquake (Gujarat), killed 971 students and 31 teachers
- Kumbakonam (Tamilnadu) fire tragedy killed 94 children in 2004
- Thousands of students and teachers were killed, injured or affected during the 2004 Tsunami
- 15 students and 3 teachers died in a boat accident during a school picnic in Kerala in 2007
- In 2010, **18** students were buried alive and **8** injured due to massive cloudburst in Bageshwar, Uttarakhand
- 759 schools damaged due to Sikkim Earthquake in 2011
- 873 schools damaged due to Uttarakhand Disaster in 2013
- In 2014 South Korea Ferry accident, more than **200** students of High School in Ansan near Seoul are dead or missing

This makes it imperative to reduce school and students' vulnerability through structural and non-structural interventions.

School safety plans play an essential role in this!

- School maps, evacuation plans and calendar of preparedness activities
- Mock drills
- Psychosocial support for children in disaster
- Consideration of disability and gender-based needs
- Periodical review and audits of inclusive School Disaster Management Plan
